# Summary of PPG spending 2015/16

## **Objectives in spending PPG:**

To provide support to deliver daily targeted intervention programmes such as phonics, reading, maths.

To ensure Pupil Premium children make good progress.

To enable Pupil premium Children to access school trips and clubs.

To provide TA support to enable the class teacher to spend more time engaged in direct teaching of all pupil groups.

### Summary of spending and actions taken for 2015-16 academic year:

Interventions Teaching Assistant employed to deliver daily intervention programmes to small groups of children, including Pupil Premium children, identified as making slow progress.

Additional TA hours to deliver daily phonics and reading sessions for Pupil Premium children on catch up programme.

Subsidise Pupil Premium children to enable them to take part in clubs, trips, residential and enrichment activities.

Subsidise uniform and school equipment costs.

To give teaching assistant support in all classes to facilitate an increase in direct teaching of small groups by the class teacher.

Support transport costs to enable school attendance.

## Outcomes to date: 2015-16 academic year:

Enabled Pupil Premium children attend trips, access clubs and to access enrichment days. Enabled Pupil Premium pupil to continue to attend this school for final year of primary education.

Early Year's foundation Stage (reception children). 2 pupils. 50% Pupil Premium children made expected or better progress in all areas. 100% made expected in all areas except Literacy.

Key Stage1 (end of year 2) 2 pupils 100% Pupil Premium children at expected standard or working at greater depth (1).

Key Stage 2 (end of year 6) 3 pupils. 100% Pupil Premium children attained expected standards in reading, writing and maths.

#### Planned spending and actions for 2016-17 academic year:

Two Teaching Assistants .3 and .4 to deliver daily intervention programmes to Pupil Premium children identified on provision map.

Continue to fund Intervention Teaching Assistant.

Intervention sessions to support targeted Pupil Premium children in maths, reading and writing.

Increased teaching assistant support in all classes to facilitate an increase in direct teaching of small groups by class teacher.

Enable FSM pupils to take part in school enrichment activities, trips, clubs and go on residential (year 5 and 6).

To fund Relax kids sessions for identified children.
