Thank you to all parents that quickly read my letter yesterday - the difference at pick up was noticeable. If you can ensure that both parents and any other adult involved in pick up can also read it, everyone will be consistent. It has also been brought to my attention that the pavement between the village hall and the Thirsty Farmer has been getting a bit congested. If possible try to park elsewhere or try to be mindful of those who are trying to walk past safely. Some of our year 6 children who walk home have commented that they need to walk in the road to avoid groups of parents. I appreciate it is not easy as the layout and width of the pavements makes this challenging, particularly with the number of people around at that time.

### Pick Up Time for Reception

For pick up week commencing 21st September children in reception are to be collected at 3.20pm as part of the usual pick up for the younger children.

## PE Kits

Children in Key Stage 2 need to have PE kit in school as normal. This includes a yellow T-shirt, (the office are in the process of ordering some more), black, blue or grey shorts or tracksuit bottoms and suitable trainers.

#### **SIMS** Parent

We will soon be requesting that parents log into the SIMs Parent App to check all their details, for example, addresses, contact numbers etc. It is important that we have a minimum of two contact numbers for every child in case of emergency. More details next week.

#### Attendance and Illness

The Department for Education and Devon County Council are monitoring school attendance on a daily basis. When a child is not in attendance we have a coding system that has to specify the reason. It is therefore important that parents are clear on this. If you state your child is displaying symptoms associated with Coronavirus you must organise to get your child tested and obtain the results before they can return to school.

# What to do if your child has symptoms

- 1. Get a test to check if they have coronavirus as soon as possible.
- 2. Stay at home and do not have visitors until you get the test result only leave your home to have a test.

Anyone you live with, and anyone in your support bubble, must also stay at home until you get the result.
